Declare your major in Political Science in 3 easy steps!



1. Find out your GPA

If you are a new student, or you have earned at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA at the U of U, you are eligible for full major status in Political Science. You can check your cumulative GPA by running a degree audit in My Degree Dashboard or checking your grades in the Campus Information System.



2. View requirements

3. Meet your advisor
